RALLY SKILLS PROGRAM

Goals of Rally Skills Program

The Rally Skills Program's goals are to provide a safe space for young people and adults to learn and develop skills driving on gravel, with an emphasis on providing a gateway into Motorsport.

By developing a driver education program, we aim to educate drivers on the skills required to drive on gravel, as well as learn general driving skills. We will provide students an outlet to learn in a safe environment, being taught by experienced instructors in a family-friendly environment.

Students will use a supplied vehicle during the Program, to get experience and decide if they would like to pursue the sport, before having to outlay equipment and a vehicle, which can be a barrier to people participating.

The program aims to provide on ongoing support to assist students of the program to continue to develop skills and further their careers. We hope to start a buddy system where a participant can continue to be mentored by another club member to help them increase their skills and continue into the next level of Motorsport.

The program consists of 3 full day sessions/lessons with final event day when students get the opportunity to compete in a Walkerville All Cars Club Khanacross. The program will run once per year. A maximum of 12 students, split into two groups of 6.

Day One Focuses On:

Introductions to fellow participants and an overview of the program.

Safety Equipment in Motorsport.

Scrutineering in Motorsport and its role.

Basic driving techniques on gravel, tailored to each student's existing skill level.

Day Two Focuses On:

Refining cornering and braking techniques on the track. Understanding and utilising pace notes.

Manual gearbox techniques.

Different types of tyres, and tyre changing.

Day Three Focuses On:

Rally rules.

What a navigator does.

Cost to build Khanacross/Autocross/Rally Sprint/Rally Cars. Fire Safety.

Day four (Competition Day):

Participants will pair up to compete in the thrilling Khanacross event. On track will be very much Reinforce what's been learnt.

Local Mawson Lakes survivor steps up against prostate cancer

It's a disease that takes a high toll, having claimed the lives of more than 18,000 Australians over the past five years.

And now one local man has decided to take action, joining with hundreds of Australians to improve awareness of prostate cancer.

"Prostate cancer is the most commonly diagnosed cancer in Australia, and yet very few people in our community understand the disease," said campaigner Peter Raedel.

"It's a disease that has impacted me personally, which is why I decided to step up and take a stand."

Peter has joined Prostate Cancer Foundation of Australia's Walk for Him campaign, with hundreds of men and women expected to walk 25,000kms during Men's Health Week, raising awareness and funds to fight the disease.

"It is very important for me that as many men as: possible get tested for prostate cancer, so that my sons, nephews, friends, grandsons and all men avoid ending up with terminal prostate cancer," said Peter.

"Unfortunately, I did not listen about being tested until my prostate cancer had become metastatic, escaping the prostate.

"I underwent chemotherapy and continue to have hormone therapy and daily medication. I have lost some muscle strength and have some horrible side effects. The worse is knowing this was avoidable.

"Awareness is a powerful tool, the more that we talk about it, the more this can be avoidable. If talking about it saves 1 life it is worth it."

Around 290 of men are diagnosed with prostate cancer each year in Mawson Lakes and the surrounding region.

Peter has already met his fundraising goal of \$1000 and hopes to raise even more as part of his Walk for Him.

"My walk will be dedicated to all the men in families in our region who have been impacted, supporting access to clinical trials and prostate cancer nurses provided by the Prostate Cancer Foundation." he said.

"We know that awareness saves lives, improving action on early detection and treatment."

The campaign will run from June 10-16 for Men's Health Week, inviting men and women to walk 25kms during the week in solidarity with men and families impacted by the disease.

"Over the past five years alone, more than 120,000 Australian men have been diagnosed with prostate cancer, and, tragically, more than 18,000 have died from the disease," said PCFA's CEO, Anne Savage.

"It's a disease that takes a significant toll not just on men, but also on their partners and families, on their communities, and on the health of the nation.

"With more than 250,000 Australians impacted by a prostate cancer diagnosis, and more than 25,000 men likely to be diagnosed this year, community action is key to saving lives."

According to the Australian Institute of Health and Welfare, prostate cancer is the most commonly diagnosed cancer in Australia, accounting for more hospitalisations than any other type of cancer.

"The cost of treating prostate cancer in Australia each year is over \$1.35 billion – a figure that continues to rise as more and more men are diagnosed.

"Our aim is to bring men and women impacted by prostate cancer together during Men's Health Week to raise \$250,000 in the Walk for Him.

"All funds raised will go towards supporting men and their families, funding clinical trials, prostate cancer nurses, and our nationwide telenursing service.

"With 1 in 5 Australian men likely to be diagnosed with prostate cancer in their lifetime, joint action has never been so important."
