# A Fast Start to 2025: Walky Park Rallysprint Kicks Off the Season

The 2025 motorsport season roared to life on Sunday, April 6th, as the Walkerville All Cars Club hosted the first round of the season with the Harries Contracting Walky Park Series Rally Sprint. With a strong field of competitors, ranging from eager juniors to seasoned veterans, the first Rallysprint event of the year did not disappoint.

2024 SA Rallysprint Championship winner Oscar Farnden, was the standout performance of the day who claimed 1st outright with a blistering time of 18:40.030. Farnden's drive set the tone for what promises to be a fiercely competitive year ahead.

Andrew Gleeson took 2nd outright with a time of 19:28.880, securing the win in the P4 (2WD over 2001cc) class. Close behind was Nick White, who claimed 3rd outright at 19:47.570, also placing 2nd in the same P4 class.

Yannike Schutz put in an impressive drive to take the win in the Women's Series, clocking 22:14.030 and finishing in the top half of the field overall. Class Highlights

- P3 (1601cc-2000cc) saw Stephen Barker come out on top with a time of 22:41.600.
- P4 (2WD over 2001cc) had a deep field, with nine drivers in the mix, making it one of the most competitive classes of the day.

Details are in Walky Park Club Series 2025, Section 7, Article 2
The prize will be drawn in person during the AGM / Awards Night at the December Club

- Each Competitor will receive one entry into the draw for each Round/Heat that the competitor Starts in the 2025 season, with a maximum of up to eight entries for any competitor that completes the full season.



#### **RALLY SKILLS PROGRAM - 2025**

#### Goals of Rally Skills Program

The Rally Skills Program's goals are to provide a safe space for young people and adults to learn and develop skills driving on gravel, with an emphasis on providing a gateway into Motorsport.

By developing a driver education program, we aim to educate drivers on the skills required to drive on gravel, as well as learn general driving skills. We will provide students an outlet to learn in a safe environment, being taught by experienced instructors in a family-friendly environment.

Students will use a supplied vehicle during the Program, to get experience and decide if they would like to pursue the sport, before having to outlay equipment and a vehicle, which can be a barrier to people participating.

The program aims to provide on ongoing support to assist students of the program to continue to develop skills and further their careers. We hope to start a buddy system where a participant can continue to be mentored by another club member to help them increase their skills and continue into the next level of Motorsport.

The program consists of 3 full day sessions/lessons with final event day when students get the opportunity to compete in a Walkerville All Cars Club Khanacross. The program will run once per year. A maximum of 12 students, split into two groups of 6.



#### **RALLY SKILLS PROGRAM - 2025**

#### **Goals of Rally Skills Program**

#### Day 1 of the program - 5th April

Please arrive by 9:00am as we will need to complete some paperwork, and everyone needs to sign on to be covered by insurance. There will be a drivers' briefing at 9:30. This is compulsory for both students and trainers/officials. Safety is paramount and the first sessions will cover car and personal safety, allocate students to their groups, how to put on a helmet, correct seating position and scrutineering of the RSP cars. After lunch, we will start working on cornering, weight transfer and stop/start, both theory and in car. Cars will be provided by RSP.

#### Day 2 of the program - 28th June

Activities will include cornering/gear changes, left foot braking, rally rules, Co-driver duties, pace notes, tyre technology and how to change a tyre safely.

#### Day 3 of the program - 27th September

Activities will include reinforcing day 1 & 2 skills, dummy Khanacross track, Event entry via Motorsport Australia (MA) portal, cost of building a Khanacross car, loading and towing a car trailer safely, Fire safety including extinguishing a fire.

#### Day 4 of the program - 26th October

You will participate in a timed Khanacross competition. Using your knowledge from day 3, you will be responsible to enter the event via the MA portal (we will assist if you have any problems). If you have your own car, you may use it for day 4 provided it passes scrutineering on the day, other wise a RSP car will be allocated to you.

The Chair of the Stewards Panel is investigating the supply of Stewards and Course Checker reports to Clerks of the Course.  It is recognised that the majority of events in the Northern Territory have
	recently shifted to AASA. Motorsport Australia is investigating ways to retain the permitting of those and other events.  Grants are open for AED's (de-fibs) for Clubs.  Motorsport Australia has employed a Grant Manager to assist clubs in completing grant applications.  Motorsport Australia Concussion Guidelines have been updated.  Many date changes/additions were approved by the State Council.  State Council has approved the dates for the Flinders to Fleurieu Rally to be held on 21 - 26 September, 2026.  Several discipline regulations were approved by State Council.
