Walkerville All Cars Club hosted Round 3 of the SA Autocross Series, combined with Round 4 of the Walky Park Rallysprint Series on Sunday, 28 September. Competitors faced a full day of competition with a field of 24 starters.

In the Rallysprint, Luke Winterfield continued his strong form, taking the win with a commanding time of 15:35.070. Only seconds behind, Andrew Gleeson secured second place in 15:39.840, while Michael Stanford rounded out the top three on 15:53.880. Paul Knopka and Terry Schutz also impressed, finishing fourth and fifth respectively, both putting down consistent and quick runs throughout the day. It wasnt a great day for Oscar Farnden who was forced to retire due to car issues.

In the Women's Series, Yannike Schutz topped the standings with a smooth and confident drive, finishing 8th outright in 17:29.420, and also claimed victory in the Junior category.

Alongside the Rallysprint competition, drivers also battled it out in the Autocross component of Round 4 of the Walky Park Series. The quick and flowing layout tested car control and consistency, rewarding those who could balance speed with precision. Once again, Luke Winterfield proved unbeatable, taking out the Autocross Outright win with a time of 15:35.070. Hot on his heels was Andrew Gleeson, just 4.77 seconds behind, while Nick White completed the podium with a tidy drive for third.

Other standout performances came from Geoffrey Wilson and Damien Wilson, who both showed strong pace to finish fourth and fifth respectively, with Wayne Casey rounding out the top six.

Class honours were closely contested:

- Class W: Luke Winterfield took the win ahead of Oscar Farnden.
- Class E: Andrew Gleeson claimed first, with Nick White in second.
- Class C: Geoffrey Wilson led the way, finishing ahead of Damien Wilson.
- Class A: Wayne Casey took victory over Jim Roberts.

The combination of fine weather, a well-prepared track, and enthusiastic competitors made for an enjoyable and competitive day.



RALLY SKILLS PROGRAM - 2025

Goals of Rally Skills Program

The Rally Skills Program's goals are to provide a safe space for young people and adults to learn and develop skills driving on gravel, with an emphasis on providing a gateway into Motorsport.

By developing a driver education program, we aim to educate drivers on the skills required to drive on gravel, as well as learn general driving skills. We will provide students an outlet to learn in a safe environment, being taught by experienced instructors in a family-friendly environment.

Students will use a supplied vehicle during the Program, to get experience and decide if they would like to pursue the sport, before having to outlay equipment and a vehicle, which can be a barrier to people participating.

The program aims to provide on ongoing support to assist students of the program to continue to develop skills and further their careers. We hope to start a buddy system where a participant can continue to be mentored by another club member to help them increase their skills and continue into the next level of Motorsport.

The program consists of 3 full day sessions/lessons with final event day when students get the opportunity to compete in a Walkerville All Cars Club Khanacross. The program will run once per year. A maximum of 12 students, split into two groups of 6.



RALLY SKILLS PROGRAM - 2025

Goals of Rally Skills Program

Day 1 of the program - 5th April

Please arrive by 9:00am as we will need to complete some paperwork, and everyone needs to sign on to be covered by insurance. There will be a drivers' briefing at 9:30. This is compulsory for both students and trainers/officials. Safety is paramount and the first sessions will cover car and personal safety, allocate students to their groups, how to put on a helmet, correct seating position and scrutineering of the RSP cars. After lunch, we will start working on cornering, weight transfer and stop/start, both theory and in car. Cars will be provided by RSP.

Day 2 of the program - 28th June

Activities will include cornering/gear changes, left foot braking, rally rules, Co-driver duties, pace notes, tyre technology and how to change a tyre safely.

Day 3 of the program - 27th September


