

TRACK COMMITTEE

- The track committee have been hard at work again and have constructed a permanent shelter for Greta and Sonya, from where they can direct competitors to the start garages. We have named it "Greta's Grotto".
- We had another tyre blowout on the big grader. We got the old tyre off last week and it only took us 2 hours this time rather than 4 hours. Practice makes perfect so they say.
- We are working on a solar system to power our timing system, we now have all the major components and need to have a working B to complete the installation.
- As part of that project we are looking at enclosing the balcony to make the area more secure, and will need a working B to install the cladding and windows.
- The RSP Shed is progressing, the building application has been lodged and we are awaiting approval.

We had a meeting recently to plan for the 2026 program.

We decided to retire the Hyundai Coupe as it requires too much time to get it reliable and have since replaced it with a Lancer. The yellow Excel needs some work so will only be used as a back up. The rest of the cars need a little TLC before day 1 which is scheduled including a wash.

As previously advised we have 12 students committed for 2026 and now 14 names for 2027.

Goals of Rally Skills Program


The Rally Skills Program's goals are to provide a safe space for young people and adults to learn and develop skills driving on gravel, with an emphasis on providing a gateway into Motorsport.

By developing a driver education program, we aim to educate drivers on the skills required to drive on gravel, as well as learn general driving skills. We will provide students an outlet to learn in a safe environment, being taught by experienced instructors in a family-friendly environment.

Students will use a supplied vehicle during the Program, to get experience and decide if they would like to pursue the sport, before having to outlay equipment and a vehicle, which can be a barrier to people participating.

The program aims to provide on ongoing support to assist students of the program to continue to develop skills and further their careers. We hope to start a buddy system where a participant can continue to be mentored by another club member to help them increase their skills and continue into the next level of Motorsport.

The program consists of 3 full day sessions/lessons with final event day when students get the opportunity to compete in a Walkerville All Cars Club Khanacross. The program will run once per year. A maximum of 12 students, split into two groups of 6.

GORGE RALLYSPRINT

THE RETURN OF THE GORGE RALLYSPRINT

In 2019, and 2020, we ran the Adelaide Gorge Rallysprint and the MSS Safety Gorge Rallysprint.

They were successful events, and they have been in the back of our minds for a while.

Now, the Gorge Rallysprint event is proposed to run again this year - twice - once on Sunday May 10 and again on Sunday August 16 subject to approvals.

Thirteen stages over the course of the day are planned using several sections of Gorge Road and Anstey Hill run in various configurations.

The event will be based out of the Paracombe Winery, a great new venue, and is in the final stages of planning.
