TOUR HISTORIC AUCHENDARROCH HOUSE & GARDENS Hosts the Milang Vintage Machinery Club

Travel through the beautiful Adelaide Hills to Mt Barker to Historic Auchendarroch House where coffee can be purchased. Morning tea provided. Come and discover South Australia's interesting history at Mt Barker's Historic Mansion and gardens. Built in 1860 as the Oakfield Hotel by Lachlan McFarlan and later purchased by businessman Robert Barr Smith who converted the hotel into a luxurious summer residence renaming it "Auchendarroch" (Gaelic for "Holy Place of the Oaks"). The mansion later served as a convalescent home and an Air Force Hospital and much more. The heritage-listed restored sandstone mansion surrounded by beautiful gardens has many secrets which you will learn on the guided tour. Lunch can be purchased at your cost in the modern Oak & Iron Bistro, an extension of Auchendarroch House.

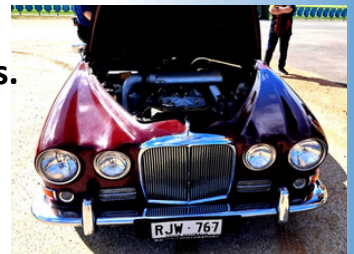

TRACK COMMITTEE

- The replacement tyre for the grader has been fitted.
- The tracks have been graded and rolled ready for the first event..
- We have started placing tyre bundles in some of the wider corners. This will be an ongoing project this year.
- The solar system is progressing. We have all the components for the system and Will Langdon is going to mount everything on a board so that it can be installed in one go, plus some cabling.
- We have started work to enclose the balcony. Please be aware that the existing railings are loose and no one should go up on the balcony unless required to. We have taped off the access. Most of the new structural work is in place but it will be approximately 4 weeks until the windows arrive. The new viewing area is lower to enable larger windows so timing personnel can see Greta's Grotto and all the tracks while seated.
- The RSP shed is also progressing. We have received building approval from the council and made a progress payment to start construction of the materials. That phase should be completed in July, and erection should take about 2 weeks to complete after that.
- Ben from Torrens Valley Mechanical serviced all of our equipment at Walky Park.

RALLY SKILLS PROGRAM

Goals of Rally Skills Program

The Rally Skills Program's goals are to provide a safe space for young people and adults to learn and develop skills driving on gravel, with an emphasis on providing a gateway into Motorsport.

By developing a driver education program, we aim to educate drivers on the skills required to drive on gravel, as well as learn general driving skills. We will provide students an outlet to learn in a safe environment, being taught by experienced instructors in a family-friendly environment.

Students will use a supplied vehicle during the Program, to get experience and decide if they would like to pursue the sport, before having to outlay equipment and a vehicle, which can be a barrier to people participating.

The program aims to provide on ongoing support to assist students of the program to continue to develop skills and further their careers. We hope to start a buddy system where a participant can continue to be mentored by another club member to help them increase their skills and continue into the next level of Motorsport.

The program consists of 3 full day sessions/lessons with final event day when students get the opportunity to compete in a Walkerville All Cars Club Khanacross. The program will run once per year. A maximum of 12 students, split into two groups of 6.

New members are always welcome! We love meeting new people who share our passion for motorsport. So come along to our next meeting and make some new friends.

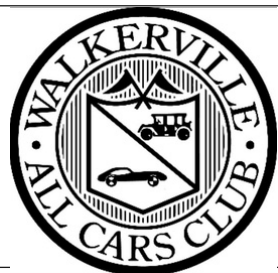

The Last Word.....

Day 2 of SRH saw me assisting with the set up and Start Control for SS13. I've not worked on a start control in over 20 years. Wow, haven't things been streamlined!

I shared the workload with Georgina Zadow, a new member of Walky for about 6 months, she is very keen and her enthusiasm was infectious.

I received the following email from Georgie. Glad you enjoyed yourself and thanks for the great feedback.

“As a new member of Walkerville All Cars Club thanks to my acceptance into the 2026 Rally Skills Program, I recently had my first experience volunteering at a gravel rally as an Official at the 2026 Shannons Rally of the Heartland on ANZAC Day.

Having previously spent some time at Start Control during the Shannons Adelaide Rally (under the guidance of Emma Smith and June Bunker), I was allocated to Start Control at Special Stage 13 “Mothercowie” under Stage Commander Scott Hochwald alongside fellow WACC members Dave Rudham, Steven Rowe and Evan Vidler, just to name a few.

On reflection, I probably should have changed back to road tyres and taken the slightly battle-scarred (and mildly unreliable) R53 RACIN6 Mini, but the too-pretty-for-such-rough-roads Winter Mini survived the adventure in and out of Mothercowie (although I am still removing bugs from the front grille weeks later). Much like the perpetual Hay Mini Nationals dirt that, like a Ninja in a sandstorm, somehow continues to materialise out of nowhere, I suspect SRH 2026 will not just leave me with fond memories, but a permanent reminder wherever the Mini and I go (but Minis do also like to “mark their territory” so the sentiment is mutual).



As this was my first gravel rally as an Official, I really didn't know what to expect, but I honestly couldn't have asked for a better introduction. The SS13 Start Control team was knowledgeable, supportive, organised and genuinely fun to work with all day. What stood out most during the day was the culture within the team. I mean, there were definitely shenanigans, but everyone worked collaboratively, respectfully and with plenty of humour, which made for a really positive environment to learn in. As a new WACC member, it was also great to spend the day alongside fellow club members and to benefit from their years of knowledge and experience.

I especially appreciated the patience from both the Officials and some of the experienced competitors who were engaged in the very important task of gently showing me what and where to record on the time card, despite me occasionally giving off strong “deer in the headlights” energy whilst initially trying to work out the time cards and appear competent.

A few additional lessons from my first gravel rally:

- *Bring a fly net (or be smart and completely unbothered like the MIVs and wear a balaclava).*
 - *Mobile reception is merely a rumour in some of the “middle of whoop whoop” stages.*
 - * *If you decide to leave via a different road to the one you arrived on, be prepared to have absolutely no idea where you are until you get closer to civilisation again and the aforementioned and somewhat elusive mobile reception.*
 - * *Gravel rally dust is perpetual and does not apologise or discriminate.*

- * *Nice Minis are possibly not ideal rally recce vehicles. Survive? Yes. Recommend? Questionable.*

The day really reinforced how important Officials and volunteers are to rallying. Without volunteers, these events simply don't happen. I'd absolutely encourage other club members – along with family and friends – to give it a go, especially if you've been thinking about volunteering for the first time. It was a fantastic learning opportunity, a genuinely enjoyable way to spend ANZAC Day and, unexpectedly, a lot of fun”
