TRACK COMMITTEE

- The tracks have been graded and rolled ready for the next event.
- We have started placing tyre bundles in some of the wider corners. This will be an ongoing project this year.
- The solar system is progressing. We have all the components for the system and Will Langdon is going to mount everything on a board so that it can be installed in one go, plus some cabling.
- We have started work to enclose the balcony. Please be aware that the existing railings are loose and no one should go up on the balcony unless required to. We have taped off the access. Most of the new structural work is in place but it will be approximately 4 weeks until the windows arrive. The new viewing area is lower to enable larger windows so timing personnel can see Greta's Grotto and all the tracks while seated.
- The RSP shed is also progressing. We have received building approval from the council and made a progress payment to start construction of the materials. That phase should be completed in July, and erection should take about 2 weeks to complete after that.
- The small grader has developed a problem, so we only have the big grader operational at the moment. Hopefully an easy fix - watch this space.

RALLY SKILLS PROGRAM

Goals of Rally Skills Program

The Rally Skills Program's goals are to provide a safe space for young people and adults to learn and develop skills driving on gravel, with an emphasis on providing a gateway into Motorsport.

By developing a driver education program, we aim to educate drivers on the skills required to drive on gravel, as well as learn general driving skills. We will provide students an outlet to learn in a safe environment, being taught by experienced instructors in a family-friendly environment.

Students will use a supplied vehicle during the Program, to get experience and decide if they would like to pursue the sport, before having to outlay equipment and a vehicle, which can be a barrier to people participating.

The program aims to provide on ongoing support to assist students of the program to continue to develop skills and further their careers. We hope to start a buddy system where a participant can continue to be mentored by another club member to help them increase their skills and continue into the next level of Motorsport.

The program consists of 3 full day sessions/lessons with final event day when students get the opportunity to compete in a Walkerville All Cars Club Khanacross. The program will run once per year. A maximum of 12 students, split into two groups of 6.

Teams of 3-5 cars will be accepted, with a Maximum of 30 teams for 2026.

Team entry fees will be \$2500 plus garage hire or \$2950 with garage. (inc GST)

For 2026, the Event will be a 5 hour Regularity Relay, split into 2 x 2.5 hour sessions on Sunday August 23rd.

Practice sessions will be conducted on Saturday August 22nd, with one session on Sunday morning for those only able to attend on Sunday.

Teams will need to declare a target lap time for each of their drivers to achieve throughout the relay, with the fastest target lap time accepted being 1 minute 55 seconds.

Each driver must hold a minimum of a Single Event Speed licence from Motorsport Australia.

The winning team will be the team that delivers lap times the closest to its target lap time throughout the event.

Each team will have only one driver on track at any time.

Refuelling will only be permitted in the allocated fuel compound at the rear of the paddock.

Get your friends together and get your entries in - teams will be accepted strictly on a "first in" basis until the maximum number of 30 teams is reached. This is an opportunity for you and your friends to run multiple laps around the world-famous Phillip Island race track, with the challenge of delivering consistent lap times to achieve the best result for your team.

2026 will be the inaugural event of what will become a regular feature on the motorsport calendar, getting bigger and better - get your entries in to say you were there for the first!

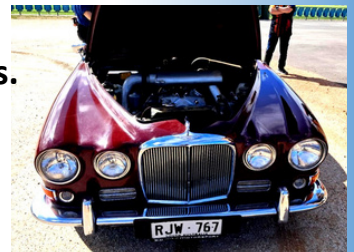
